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Research theme

Everywhere, several cultural factors affect the implementation of the kinship functions (Godelier, 2004)


Indicators of changes

Over the last decades in Western Europe (Eurostat, 2014):

- Marriage rates ↘
- Divorce rates ↗
- Rates of birth outside wedlock \approx rates of birth inside wedlock (Be, Fr, CH?)
- LATs / LTAs / Solo's / group housing ↗
- New sexual and marital tropes and norms develop, largely influenced by the medias (Bajos & Bozon, 2008).
- The definition of the **family** no longer overlaps the definition of the **household** (Bourdieu, Bonvalet).
- The family may be defined as a geographically **scattered network of affinities** more than as a kinship group.

Today, some individuals prefer to raise children by themselves (Mannis, 1999) ; others prefer to involve more than one (adult) partner in family matters (Sheff, 2014).

Research question



What are the socio-cultural factors affecting the implementation of kinship functions observable among non-monogamous family configurations?

How do you do family when you don't do couple ?

What is the epistemological impact on family and kinship studies?

Area: Western Europe
Duration: 2011 – now
Language: French


Participative Observation

- ▣ IRL: 65 gatherings (private or public)
- ▣ On line: 4 blogs • 2 forums • 6 FB pages
- ▣ 30 testimonies or short interviews (1h/r.)

Audio Interviews

- ▣ 27 life-paths of parents in a non-monogamous configuration (on location — 5h/r.) + FNM



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


